What is Canine Rehabilitation?

Canine Rehabilitation is very similar to the Physical Therapy services that have been offered for years to humans to prevent injury, following illness, injury or surgery.

The benefits of rehabilitation aim to:
↓ pain, inflammation, and swelling
↑ range of motion, strength, mobility, function and fitness.

Your canine will be thoroughly evaluated and an individualized treatment plan will be developed with you and your canine's veterinarian or surgeon.

What does Canine Rehab entail?

Depending on your canine's condition, the following treatments may be used:

- Laser
- Ultrasound
- NMES—Neuromuscular Electrical Nerve Stim
- TENS—Transcutaneous Electrical Nerve Stim
- Acupressure
- Massage therapy
- Heat / cold
- Gait re-training
- Joint / soft tissue mobilization
- Range of motion
- Stretching
- Strengthening
- Balance, coordination and proprioception
- Activity based weight management program
- Senior canine program
- Wheelchair fitting / modification
- Pre-fabricated splint fitting /modification
- Home exercise program
- Additionally, hydrotherapy and land treadmill may be utilized if client has access.



How do I know if my canine needs or would benefit from Canine Rehabilitation?

Conditions that would benefit from Canine Rehabilitation include:

- Orthopedic conditions
- Healed fractures
- New or chronic tendon sprains or inflammation
- Hip Dysplasia, patellar subluxation
- Cruciate ligament repair
- Spinal disk lesions / herniations
- Muscle weakness, degeneration, imbalance, strains or spasms
- Degenerative nerve conditions
- Lameness / gait abnormalities (difficulty walking or using one or more legs)
- Mobility problems (difficulty getting up, going ↓↑ stairs, in / out of car)
- Pain
- Obesity / sedentary lifestyle
- Arthritis
